Aristotelis Mitraras, Assistant Professor of Language and Literature at the Department of Turkish and Modern Asian Studies of the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens (since 2018), conducts research and teaching work on Turkish Literature, Turkish Theater and Translation (2018-). His research interests include topics in the history of Turkish literature, contemporary Turkish literary currents in poetry and the novel, comparative literature (Turkish and Greek), history and development of both traditional theater and Turkish theater under the influence of western theater. He was a member of the Hellenic Committee of Experts of the Ministry of Education, which examines the Turkish school textbooks (2007 – 2010). He is a member of the scientific team of the Turkish language of the State Certificate of Language Proficiency (KPG) (since 2009).
